- B. Where we are
  - 1. Geographically
    - a. Cana of Galilee, 9 miles north of Nazareth
  - 2. Culturally
    - a. A weeklong wedding event.
    - b. Is the third day the third day of the week or three days since the call of Philip and Nathanael?
      - i. John 1:45-51
- C. Who is there
  - 1. Jesus – v.1
  - 2. The five disciples of Chapter 1, verse 2
  - 3. Mary (although never called Mary) – vs. 3-5
    - a. Her request, *"They have no wine"*. – v. 3
    - b. The answer of Jesus – v. 4
      - i. This is not a rude response
        - John 19:26
      - ii. *"My hour has not yet come"*
        - John 7:30; 8:20; 12:23, 27; 13:11; 17:1
    - c. Sound advice – v. 5
- D. The first recorded miracle Jesus performed – vs. 6-11
  - 1. His orders: Fill all six water pots with water (each pot held between 20-30 gallons) – v. 6
  - 2. Jesus honors and follows cultural customs (take it to the head waiter) – vs. 7, 8
  - 3. The head waiter's response – vs. 9, 10

- a. Jesus turns water into wine
  - b. Moses turns water into blood – Exodus 7
  - c. Jesus, blood, wine, immorality, the beast and final judgement – Revelation 17:1-7
- E. The goal – purpose of miracles
  - 1. Confirm His person
  - 2. Confirm His work
  - 3. Note: *"His disciples believed in Him"* – v. 11
- F. Conclusion
  - 1. Is anything too hard for God?
    - a. Jeremiah 33:1-3; 32:17, 27
