- A. The citizens of the city (W.W.W.) verses 1-8
- B. The character of the city (W.W.W.) verses 9-22:5
- C. The city, like its creator, is hard to describe (see Chapter 1)

II. The New Jerusalem

- A. John's Escort to the city vs. 9-10
 - 1. One of the seven angels who poured out the last plagues
 - 2. This new city is called the bride of the lamb
 - 3. It is called a "Holy City" how great will that be!
 - 4. It came down out of heaven from God (James 1:17)
- B. John's exposure to the City vs. 11-17
 - 1. The city bears the glory of God compared to a very costly stone. Jasper, though often green quartz, is a name used for stones of various colors. The diamond was not known as a jewel in the first century. v. 11
 - 2. The city has 12 gates, (each with an angel), inscribed with the name of one of the Sons of Israel. v. 12
 - 3. There are three gates on each of the four sides of the city v. 13
 - On the city wall are 12 foundation stones inscribed with the names of the 12 Apostles – v. 14
 - 5. An angel measures the city with a rod (10 feet) v. 15

- 6. Dimensions of the Holy City vs. 16, 17
 - a. "Square" NASB (tetragonos = rectangle, square)
 - b. "Commentators differ as to whether the city is a cube or a pyramid. The description seems to favor the pyramid form."
 Walvoord
 - c. It is approximately 1400-1500 miles in each direction with a wall 200 feet thick or high.
 - d. "One person calculated the total base area of the city to be 1,750,329 sq. miles."

 - e. "It has been calculated that even if only 25% of this space were used for dwellings, 20 billion people could be accommodated spaciously." Ryrie
